Closed Loop Gardening at the Ghent Floralies, with ECN-partner Vlaco

Visit a vibrant city festival in Ghent's Arts Quarter in the spring of 2016 (22th of April -1st of May). Come and be surprised and inspired by a world full of flowers and plants,

fascinating gardens, breathtaking art installations, and unexpected garden techniques.

This year you can discover Closed Loop Gardening presented by the

Flemish Compost Association (VLACO vzw). Vlaco guarantees a good compost and digestate quality in Flanders, but Vlaco also sensitizes people on so-called closed loop gardening techniques. These specific gardening techniques focus on processing and re-using organic garden residues as much as possible, there where they were produced. For instance by composting at home, by keeping chickens, by mulch mowing, by processing prunings in a creative or functional way, by applying perennials ... Line by line, this way of gardening gets more popular and it provides inspiration to a lot of urban garden and greening initiatives in Flanders. Vlaco's inspirational garden



at the Floralies will show the closed loop gardening techniques one can apply. The garden consists of a modern, a classic and a rural part. We demonstrate that every garden can be a closed loop garden. There will be workshops and demonstrations during the whole period. We show how an urban garden can be build up practically and gradually, during the flower show, by using the different techniques. In our food truck we will transform leftovers into nice snacks, in order to reduce food waste.

You can find Vlaco on the KINA-square, on the edge of the Floralies site named Saint Peter's Square.

Prepare yourself for a dynamic and interactive city festival. Come, see, experience and participate in the various activities and enjoy the burst of colours, fragrances, techniques ... in this floral paradise!

Ghent Floralies uses ECN qualified compost

In addition to our inspirational garden you can also admire the superior ECN qualified compost at all locations of the Ghent Floralies. The Vlaco-compost is used as a protective layer between the plants.

Previously the Floralies had been using peat between the plants, but since the edition of 2010 they choose for sustainable Vlaco-compost. This year 140 ton compost covers the garden soils. The compost will give the final touch at the art works and protects the garden soils against the weather in April. The Floralies save 81 tons of CO2 by using Vlaco-compost instead of peat. That is equivalent to 35 families who leave their car at home during a whole year!

We are proud that the Floralies choose our Vlaco-compost. The Flemish compost producers do their best to bring every day a high-quality product on the market. This compost meets all the strict standards of the Vlaco label and ECN-QAS-label!
